CALL TO ORDER: Chairman Stahlnecker called the March 18, 2015, meeting of the Gunnison Basin Sage-grouse Strategic Committee to order at 10:00 A.M.

10:00:04 AM DETERMINATION OF QUORUM: Stahlnecker confirmed that a quorum was present.

10:01:04 AM PUBLIC NOTICE CONFIRMED: Stahlnecker verified that proper legal public notice had occurred.

10:02:04 AM AGENDA APPROVAL: No modifications to the agenda were requested. The agenda was approved as circulated.

APPROVAL of February 18, 2015 MEETING MINUTES: Moved by Navy and seconded by Wenum to accept the February 18, 2015 meeting minutes as amended. Motion carried. Peterson, Ferchau abstained.

COMMITTEE MEMBER COMMENTS/ REPORTS

10:03:04 AM

Laurie indicated that she monitored the Poncha Pass lek area early this day and observed three males.

Sage-grouse road closures are in effect reported Japuntich. He indicated that only one gate has been torn down. Cochran thanked him for all of his efforts.

Houck reported that the process for land use related reviews is in place. The Community Development Department of Gunnison County is still following standard procedure for all reviews. Cochran reviewed the procedure that his office utilizes.

Wenum indicated that there are numerous requests about the Waunita Wildlife Viewing Area.

The Gunnison sage-grouse brochures were reviewed and discussion of an update or revision/reprint occurred. Review and make corrections and then reprint? Discussion ensued. Members will review and make recommendations at the next meeting.

New terrestrial biologist is Kevin Blecha. He will be on board with CPW in April 2015. Big game open house is coming up April 2nd, 4:30pm to 7pm.

Antler collection activity has been significant this year. CPW Staff witnessed large numbers of collectors and there was concern about movement of wildlife in these areas. This may need to be reviewed at a later date.

Lek counts will start soon. Volunteers will be monitored and data collected for a review. Number of birds, people counting birds on the leks, and hours of data collection are all part of the data collected. Various lek areas were discussed.

Caloger asked about the bag limits on shed collection. This has turned into a commercial enterprise. Will CPW make this a regulated item? Wenum indicated that this has been brought up to the CPW office for review. This is a possible revenue source for the department.

Cochran indicated that the interest is enhanced by media coverage and new reality television programs. Cause and effect of collection will need to be reviewed.

Wenum indicated that more discussion from other jurisdictions will take place prior to any fees put in place.

Cochran reviewed the last time the Sage-grouse summit was held. He indicated that it was nearing the 4th year since the last summit.

McGee responded that WSCU has interest in taking the lead organizing the next Summit. Timing of the Summit was discussed. Fall of 2016 was discussed. Gunnison Sage-grouse research, habitat and climate issues are possible subjects. The Summit would tie into these and it would be a good time to introduce the Gunnison Sage-grouse / sagebrush ecosystem atlas. They would like to get a graduate student to begin development of the atlas. Marlene Crosby was contacted and there are no Landfill Mitigation funds available in this budget cycle. Seed money of \$5,000 to 15,000 would need to be raised to start this program.

The summit actually generated revenue. Fees and costs were discussed.

Peterson asked about the atlas project. Is it cause and effect or cumulative data? Cumulative data is what would be acquired with this atlas. Consensus was positive for this program but funding needs further discussion.

Vasquez indicated that USGS has a Sagemap now and asked if this could be of some help for this project.

Cochran indicated that social information was not in the USGS Sagemap. Protocol for data collection was not determined. Data collection was discussed.

Navy reviewed the Summit. The fall of 2015 would be a good time. The WSCU participants are looking for a later date. Navy would like to see a field trip as a component of the summit.

Seward indicated he is exploring a field trip for other projects. This could be combined at a future meeting or schedule an additional day. Topic closed.

10:45:21 AM LITIGATION UPDATE

Cochran commenced the review. BoCC approved 2 separate actions.

- 1) Intervene in the 2 lawsuits filed to date by pro-listing groups.
- 2) Approved intervening in the state of Colorado lawsuit challenging the threatened listing.

Mesa County filed a 60-day notice of intent to file a law suit.

Other counties that have filed Notices of Intent are Montrose County and San Juan County, Utah.

Japuntich has been released back to the Gunnison Field Office as the full time biologist. More information will be available next month.

**Gunnison Basin Weed Management Program
Update**

Cochran initiated this review. A USFWS letter was passed around for Committee review. There was a question if private applicators will they be covered by this letter. Clayton responded that no permit is needed as long as the guidelines provided in the letter are followed. Clayton indicated that they recognize the importance of weed control. There is a weed management workshop on April 10th. John Scott is monitoring the herbicides and pesticides labels for proper application of these items. Nothing was found to be hugely problematic.

12:41:37 PM FOX CONTROL PROPOSAL DISCUSSION

Peter Caloger

Fox population and coyote populations were discussed. Caloger had contacted some stockgrowers on coyote take and if there is no danger to stock let the coyotes remain. He would like to monitor the lek counts with the population of fox vs. coyote. Populations of both species were discussed on private lands. Foxes adapt to other environments. Coyotes seem to be the major predator of the foxes.

Obersoler indicated that the fox also have eagles and owls as predators.

Seward encouraged Caloger to set up a protocol for this study. A large treatment and control area would be needed.

Caloger indicated that a rancher would need to participate in this study. Taken animals then need to be sent to a facility for review of stomach contents to determine what these animals had eaten.

Seward indicated that this needs to be a scientific study. There really are two separate controls. Red Fox take and sage-grouse numbers.

Peterson indicated that this is a good idea but the mechanism needs to be set in place. The predator issue needs to be analyzed in the future.

Caloger stated the raven population in Utah was put under control. Gunnison County has an enormous raven population and it is not being addressed. The cost of processing samples by CSU was discussed. Cost of land owner participation was discussed. Caloger will contact landowners first.

Magee indicated that maybe the stomach contents from fox need to be sent to CSU and tested first.

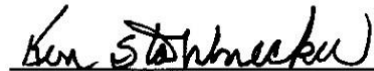
Houck asked for more information from Caloger to review this request.
