Justin opened the meeting and the group reviewed the minutes from the last meeting. Dave made a motion (2<sup>nd</sup> by Lyda) to approve the minutes. It was approved unanimously.

Amy Unger, Korbin Pugh, and Jenny Deichman from History Colorado introduced themselves. Amy suggested the HPC do a CLG intensive thematic survey grant, which determines if structures are eligible for a historic register. The due date is January 15, 2017. She offered to help with the scope of work.

The group then discussed the City Shop building and it was decided to gather as much information on the structure, as well as preservation funding information in order to present to the City. Jody said she had an intern that will work on compiling the info. Justin said he would look into History Colorado processes that might be helpful.

Jody said she has two interns that will be starting soon and will be putting in about 15 hours each for the semester. Their work will be focused on photo collection and coordination with the downtown spreadsheet information.

Lee Ann described the issues with the Fairview Schoolhouse and needing to find a new owner. The group asked Lee Ann to gather more information for discussion at the next meeting.

Dave said the 10' tall railroad milepost he found has been refurbished, is looking great, and is on display at the Pioneer museum.

Items for next agenda: Fairview Schoolhouse, City Shop, Budget update, and next steps with CLG survey grant.

The meeting was adjourned at 6:00.
