Justin opened the meeting. Justin (2nd by Jody) made a motion to approve the minutes for November and it was approved unanimously.

Jim Barry described the talk Derrick Everett will give about the Aberdeen quarry on April 13th at Western's Taylor Auditorium. He gave some history at Aberdeen and then discussed with the board the Pioneer Museum's needs and efforts at Aberdeen, which include building a small bridge, beaver control, and vandalism. He said Phil Crossley's geography class will map the quarry in detail.

Dave talked with Western's Dustin fife about organizing a grant to digitize local historic newspapers. Justin (2nd by Lee Ann) made a motion to use \$750 from the budget toward the project to digitize local historic newspapers. It was approved unanimously.

Lee Ann said she met with Jim Gelwick about the sign project and that it has stalled. Jim told Lee Ann about an old cabin at the Lazy K property and asked whether it should be preserved. The HPC said they are interested but needed more information from the City about the cabin.

Justin said he will pick some photos for the general Gunnison County website and send those to Mike.

The group discussed the pros and cons of keeping the old HPC internet URL. One benefit is that it is used on many old HPC brochures. Dave and Mike will work on this and report back.

Jody said the State recently updated there tax credit rules and that the group should consider offering that as a service. She said she will get more info and report back.
