The group discussed Webster Hall for an outreach brochure.

The group were very pleased with the outcome of the first Historic Agricultural Significance Honors Program award. The Irby family were pleased and the display in the paper came out well.

The group discussed the signage for the City Hall. Jody said she would add verbiage to sign about architecture and the everyone should think about good sign material options.

Jody presented some information about how Carbondale treats antennas on historically designated structures, which centers around trying to find a location that minimizes its visibility. The group preferred language that provides guidance rather than firm rules. Central City has more explicit language and also use detailed design guidelines. The group didn't want to create design guidelines.

The group discussed a historic survey of structures in Somerset and how it might be a good candidate for a CLG grant. Hartman's Castle was also discussed as another possibility.

Jody said she would convert the historic designation application into an editable PDF, which could then be placed on our HPC website.

The group asked Mike to add the Agricultural Significance Honors Program to our website.

David mentioned that Tuck's Cabin on the Bill Lacy's property is something the public would like to see protected but that the owner hasn't shown interest in doing. The group felt writing an article about it might help.
