Regular Meeting – November 28, 2022

Jody told the group that the application to reapply for the Somerset Historic Survey grant should be ready around the first of the year and be submitted on January 13th.

Jody suggested it would be good if someone on HPC could work on a new building research project until we get a new intern.

The group discussed how best to use the donation Narcissa Channel gave to the HPC on behalf of ex-member Patti Bippus. They said it could be used to pay for the next downtown sign, possibly the Johnson Building, Episcopal Church, or the old Gunnison Hotel.

LeeAnn made a motion (2nd Shelley) to approve the minutes from the October meeting. It was approved unanimously.

Jody said she has been working 330 White Rock Ave in Crested Butte. The group discussed the evidence for the year it was built.

Kathleen brought up issues with the Pioneer museum, including a lack of funds to hire a director and the need to find additional archival storage.

Mike told the group that the old library is likely to be used for County social services and not available for historical archiving. However, the basement of the Blackstock building might be a possibility.

Shelley told the group she plans on attending the Saving Places Conference in 2023.

The group decided to skip a December meeting.
