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Summary

The National Community Survey™ (The NCS™) is a collaborative effort between National Research Center, Inc. (NRC) and the International City/County Management Association (ICMA). The survey and its administration are standardized to assure high quality research methods and directly comparable results across The NCS communities. The NCS captures residents’ opinions within the three pillars of a community (Community Characteristics, Governance and Participation) across eight central facets of community (Safety, Mobility, Natural Environment, Built Environment, Economy, Recreation and Wellness, Education and Enrichment and Community Engagement). This report summarizes Gunnison County’s performance in the eight facets of community livability with the “General” rating as a summary of results from the overarching questions not shown within any of the eight facets. The “Overall” represents the community pillar in its entirety (the eight facets and general).

By summarizing resident ratings across the eight facets and three pillars of a livable community, a picture of Gunnison County’s community livability emerges. Below, the color of each community facet summarizes how residents rated each of the pillars that support it – Community Characteristics, Governance and Participation. When most ratings were higher than the benchmark, the color is the darkest shade; when most ratings were lower than the benchmark, the color is the lightest shade. A mix of ratings (higher and lower than the benchmark) results in a color between the extremes.

Broadly, ratings for community livability tended to be commensurate with national benchmarks. Evaluations for the facet of Natural Environment within Community Characteristics and Governance, as well as aspects for Mobility within Participation, exceeded levels nationwide. This information can be helpful in identifying the areas that merit more attention.



About

The National Community Survey™ (The NCS™) report is about the “livability” of Gunnison County. The phrase “livable community” is used here to evoke a place that is not simply habitable, but that is desirable. It is not only where people do live, but where they want to live.


Great communities are partnerships of the government, private sector, community-based organizations and residents, all geographically connected. The NCS captures residents’ opinions within the three pillars of a community (Community Characteristics, Governance and Participation) across eight central facets of community (Safety, Mobility, Natural Environment, Built Environment, Economy, Recreation and Wellness, Education and Enrichment and Community Engagement).

The Community Livability Report provides the opinions of a representative sample of 429 residents of Gunnison County. The margin of error around any reported percentage is 5% for all respondents. The full description of methods used to garner these opinions can be found in the *Technical Appendices* provided under separate cover.



Quality of Life in Gunnison County

About 8 in 10 residents rated the quality of life in Gunnison County as excellent or good. This level was on par with national and peer comparison communities (see Appendix B of the *Technical Appendices* provided under separate cover).



Shown below are the eight facets of community. The color of each community facet summarizes how residents rated it across the three sections of the survey that represent the pillars of a community – Community Characteristics, Governance and Participation. When most ratings across the three pillars were higher than the benchmark, the color for that facet is the darkest shade; when most ratings were lower than the benchmark, the color is the lightest shade. A mix of ratings (higher and lower than the benchmark) results in a color between the extremes.


In addition to a summary of ratings, the image below includes one or more stars to indicate which community facets were the most important focus areas for the community. As in 2017, residents identified Economy and Natural Environment as priorities for the Gunnison County community in the coming two years. Evaluations for the facet of Mobility exceeded national averages, while the remaining aspects were similar to national benchmark comparisons. This overview of the key aspects of community quality provides a quick summary of where residents see exceptionally strong performance and where performance offers the greatest opportunity for improvement. Linking quality to importance offers community members and leaders a view into the characteristics of the community that matter most and that seem to be working best.

Details that support these findings are contained in the remainder of this Livability Report, starting with the ratings for Community Characteristics, Governance and Participation and ending with results for Gunnison County’s unique questions.

Community Characteristics

What makes a community livable, attractive and a place where people want to be?

Overall quality of community life represents the natural ambience, services and amenities that make for an attractive community. How residents rate their overall quality of life is an indicator of the overall health of a community. In the case of Gunnison County, around 9 in 10 rated the county as an excellent or good place to live. Respondents' ratings of Gunnison County as a place to live were commensurate with ratings across the nation.

In addition to rating the county as a place to live, respondents rated several aspects of community quality including Gunnison County as a place to raise children and to retire, their neighborhood as a place to live, the overall image or reputation of Gunnison County and its overall appearance. At least 7 in 10 residents felt favorably about most aspects of the community, providing ratings similar to those of other communities across the U.S. Around half of respondents were pleased with the county as a place to retire, which was also on par with benchmark comparisons, but decreased from 2017 to 2019 (see the *Trends over Time* report for more details).

Delving deeper into Community Characteristics, survey respondents rated over 40 features of the community within the eight facets of Community Livability. Overall, most residents' ratings for aspects across the pillar of Community Characteristics were positively scored by about 6 in 10 respondents and tended to be similar to national and peer benchmarks.




Almost all respondents gave excellent or good scores to each aspect of Safety and ratings for the overall feeling of safety in the community were higher than the national benchmark. Gunnison County participants were also pleased with the Natural Environment with at least 8 in 10 awarding excellent or good marks to each aspect; evaluations for the overall natural environment and air quality exceeded averages in national and peer communities. Similarly, residents appreciated the ease of travel by most modes of transportation (walking, biking and public transportation) at levels that outmatched those seen nationwide and about three-quarters also gave high scores to the overall ease of travel, availability of paths and walking trails and ease of travel by car, ratings that were comparable to their peers.

Evaluations within the areas of Economy and Recreation and Wellness tended to be more mixed. Residents gave top marks to the county as a place to visit, and to recreational and fitness opportunities, surpassing both national and peer averages. Respondents' felt less favorably about the overall economic health, cost of living and shopping opportunities, as well as the availability of both mental health care and health care in general; all of these ratings lagged behind the benchmarks. Participants' reviews of housing in Gunnison County (variety of housing and availability of quality affordable housing) were also below average. Conversely, respondents felt that shopping opportunities, employment opportunities and Gunnison County as a place to work improved in 2019, achieving more positive results than in all previous years since the survey was administered.

Percent rating positively (e.g., excellent/good)



Governance


How well does the government of Gunnison County meet the needs and expectations of its residents?

The overall quality of the services provided by Gunnison County as well as the manner in which these services are provided is a key component of how residents rate their quality of life. About 7 in 10 survey respondents gave excellent or good ratings to the overall services provided by the County. Marks for County services, as well as services provided by the Federal Government, were similar to national averages.

Survey respondents also rated various aspects of Gunnison County’s leadership and governance. Roughly half of residents rated most aspects positively, similar to those in other communities nationwide and stable over time. About three-quarters of respondents scored the customer service provided by County employees as excellent or good.

Respondents evaluated 30 individual services and amenities available in Gunnison County. Broadly, at least 6 in 10 residents rated most of these services and amenities favorably and were generally similar to or higher than communities across the U.S. The strongest services were related to Natural Environment, with three-quarters or more praising drinking water, open space (a rating that improved in 2019) and preservation of natural areas, and outshining scores in peer and national comparison communities. Gunnison County residents also lauded bus or transit services (81% excellent or good) at above-average levels. All other services were similar to ratings seen in other benchmark communities, with the exception of sheriff and recycling services.

Overall Quality of County Services




In 2019, most services were scored similarly to previous iterations of the survey; however, more residents gave positive reviews to fire prevention, but fewer felt favorably about road repair and cable television.


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Figure 2: Aspects of Governance

Participation

Are the residents of Gunnison County connected to the community and each other?

An engaged community harnesses its most valuable resource, its residents. The connections and trust among residents, government, businesses and other organizations help to create a sense of community, a shared sense of membership, belonging and history. Similar to other communities in the U.S., about 7 in 10 respondents gave excellent or good marks to the sense of community in Gunnison County.


About 8 in 10 survey respondents indicated they would recommend living in Gunnison County to someone who asked and planned to remain in the community for the next five years. These ratings were stable over time and similar to levels reported across the nation.

The survey included over 30 activities and behaviors for which respondents indicated how often they participated in or performed each, if at all. Participation rates in activities in the community across facets varied, but were mostly on par with national averages.

Gunnison County respondents were less likely to stock supplies in case of emergency, but were more likely to work within the county than those in comparison communities. Residents were especially engaged in the use of alternative modes of transportation in lieu of driving (public transit, carpooling, walking or biking), as about half or more of respondents indicated they did each; these rates outpaced levels seen in comparison communities.

Further, more residents reported they had used public transportation instead of driving in 2019 than in previous years.

Sense of Community




Gunnison County community members reported rates on either side of the spectrum for Education and Enrichment and Community Engagement. Within Education, about two-thirds of respondents indicated they had used County public libraries or attended County-sponsored special events (a rating that exceeded national averages). Yet, only one-third of respondents had participated in religious or spiritual activities, which was below-average nationally. Similarly, participants' rates for volunteering (59%), participating in clubs (40%) and attending local public meetings (37%) surpassed national and peer levels, while less than 1 in 10 had watched a local public meeting, a rate that fell short of both sets of benchmark averages.


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Figure 3: Aspects of Participation




Special Topics

Gunnison County included several questions of special interest on The NCS. County leadership sought residents' feedback regarding the quality and ease of accessing government services, the accuracy of the County's strategic planning areas, support regarding taxes to fund library service improvements, climate change measures and priorities for recreation improvements.

Residents evaluated nine additional services that are provided by Gunnison County and more than half gave favorable reviews to most of these services. Respondents were most pleased with parenting classes and child support services, with around 6 in 10 assigning excellent or good ratings to each. About 4 in 10 respondents gave positive evaluations to drug and alcohol and mental health services.


Figure 4: Quality of Additional Gunnison County Services

Gunnison County residents generally felt that it was easy to access public health services (77% very or somewhat easy), and about 4 in 10 indicated they could access public benefits, early childhood services, senior services, and youth and family services. Less than 1 in 10 community members reported it was very difficult to access any of these services.

Figure 5: Ease of Accessing County Services


Please indicate how easy or difficult it is for you to use or access the following services:



Regarding the accuracy of the five One Valley Prosperity Strategy areas, about half of residents felt these issues very closely represented the most significant challenges in Gunnison County and one-third stated they somewhat closely resembled the most pressing issues.

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When asked if they would support a property tax increase to fund library improvements, about one-quarter of respondents stated they were very likely to do so and another 20% were somewhat likely to support. A majority of survey participants were very or somewhat unlikely to approve additional funding. However, about half of respondents would be more likely to support the levy if the County expanded physical and digital collections and around 4 in 10 would be much more or a little more likely to vote in favor of funding additional programs (such as teen, young adult and adult programs, adult classes, speakers, author readings and early literacy education) and increased technology access.

How likely are you to support a 1.9 mill levy increase (costing \$13.41 per \$100,000 of actual residential property value annually, beginning in 2020) to fund library services?





Figure 8: Likelihood of Supporting Funds for Library Services



County leadership also asked residents how they envisioned the County's role in reducing energy use and emissions in order to address climate change. Half of respondents felt the County should 1) initiate valley-wide efforts through education and incentives, and 2) seek funding to reduce use and build renewable energy resources. Only one-quarter of community members stated the City should use their authority to mandate action through enforcement or land use policy.

What do you think the County's role should be in reducing energy use and emissions to address climate change?



Further, one-third of residents indicated they would like the County to power its buildings using only renewable energy, even at an additional cost, while a majority would like for the switch to renewable energy to be less expensive or pay for itself over time.

Should the County power its buildings completely with renewable energy?




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Residents were asked to choose three recreation areas that should be prioritized by the Sustainable Tourism & Outdoor Recreation Committee to address trail development, maintenance and more. The most frequently chosen area was Taylor Park with nearly half selecting this natural space for improvement and around one-third selecting Gothic Campground, Shady Island River Park, Almont River Put-in, Signal Peak or Judd Falls. Less than 1 in 10 survey participants felt Rustler's Gulch should be a priority.

Conclusions

Gunnison County residents are pleased with Recreation services, but may want more attention on Wellness.

Overall, ratings for aspects related to Recreation tended to be on par with national and peer comparison communities; at least 8 in 10 respondents praised County parks, recreation programs and recreation centers. Around 7 in 10 or more community members reported being in good health and maintained a healthy diet and exercise regimen, similar to rates reported in communities nationwide. Residents were particularly pleased with fitness and recreational opportunities, with at least 8 in 10 lauding these community aspects, which exceeded benchmark averages. About three-quarters of respondents felt it was very or somewhat easy to access public health services, such as immunizations. Conversely, less than 4 in 10 survey participants felt positively about the availability of affordable quality mental health care and general health care services, indicating access to these services may be an area of focus for Gunnison County.

The Natural Environment contributes to the quality of life in Gunnison County.

Survey participants not only prioritized Natural Environment as a key focus area for Gunnison County in the coming years, but also rated aspects of this facet positively and generally higher than or similar to the national averages. At least 9 in 10 respondents felt positively about the County's overall natural environment and air quality, which eclipsed ratings in national and peer communities. Residents also thought highly of green services, including drinking water, natural areas preservation and open space; each of these services were also ranked higher than communities across the nation. Around 8 in 10 community members demonstrated their commitment to the environment by conserving water and recycling at home; however, they felt that recycling services provided by the County were lacking, with only around half awarding positive scores, which lagged behind national averages.

County leadership also sought feedback regarding environmental issues and policies. Around half of residents supported the County taking initiative to reduce energy use and emissions to address climate change through education and providing incentives, as well as seeking funding to reduce use and build renewable energy resources. Moreover, nearly all residents felt the County should power its buildings completely with renewable energy; about half supported this action, but felt the upgrades should be less expensive or pay for themselves over time, while one-third would support using renewable energy even at an additional cost.

Public transportation is a valued asset to residents.

Residents see Mobility as a strength, and commend alternative modes of transportation in Gunnison County in particular. About three-quarters of respondents felt positively about the overall ease of travel, availability of paths and walking trails and ease of transit by car, which was commensurate with peer and national comparisons. However, participants' evaluations for ease of travel by walking, bicycling and public transportation surpassed U.S. averages, with at least 6 in 10 awarding top marks to each. Similarly, residents were generally pleased with car-related Mobility services, including traffic enforcement, road repair and snow removal, but their scores for bus or transit services exceeded the benchmarks, with 8 in 10 providing excellent or good reviews. Not surprisingly, Gunnison County community members were more likely to participate in alternative modes of travel, such as carpooling, using public transportation (a rate that increased since 2017), and walking or biking instead of driving, compared to residents across the nation.

Economy ratings are on the rise, but challenges remain.

As in previous years, residents indicated that Economy was a key community focus area for the future. Scores for the vibrancy of the downtown area, overall quality of business and service establishments and the county as a place to work were given positive marks by about half of survey participants and were on par with comparison averages. Respondents identified the community as a place to visit as a strength, with 9 in 10 assigning excellent or good ratings. In 2019, scores for shopping opportunities, employment opportunities and the county as a place to work improved; in fact, all ratings for each of these aspects of the community were at their highest level since the County began gathering feedback in 2009. However, evaluations of shopping opportunities, as well as overall economic health and cost of living lagged behind levels seen nationwide.

This report discusses trends over time, comparing the 2019 ratings for Gunnison County to its previous survey results in 2009, 2011, 2013, 2015 and 2017. Additional reports and technical appendices are available under separate cover.

Trend data for Gunnison County represent important comparison data and should be examined for improvements or declines. Deviations from stable trends over time, especially, represent opportunities for understanding how local policies, programs or public information may have affected residents' opinions.

Meaningful differences between survey years have been noted within the following tables as being "higher" or "lower" if the differences are greater than seven percentage points between the 2017 and 2019 surveys, otherwise the comparisons between 2017 and 2019 are noted as being "similar." Additionally, benchmark comparisons for all survey years are presented for reference. Changes in the benchmark comparison over time can be impacted by various trends, including varying survey cycles for the individual communities that comprise the benchmarks, regional and national economic or other events, as well as emerging survey methodologies.

Overall, ratings in Gunnison County for 2019 generally remained stable. Of the 127 items for which comparisons were available, 116 items were rated similarly in 2017 and 2019, three items showed a decrease in ratings and eight showed an increase in ratings. Notable trends over time included the following:

- Ratings for Community Characteristics largely remained stable, with only one aspect decreasing (Gunnison County as a place to retire) and four aspects increasing (shopping opportunities, employment opportunities, the county as a place to work and opportunities to participate in community matters) since 2017.
- Ratings for services and amenities provided by Gunnison County were consistent over time, with two increases and two decreases from 2017 to 2019. Residents were more pleased with fire prevention and open spaces, but were less satisfied with road repair and cable television services since the last survey administration.
- In 2019, more Gunnison County residents reported being in good physical health and utilizing public transportation in lieu of driving compared to 2017 levels.

Appendix B: Benchmark Comparisons

Comparison Data

NRC’s database of comparative resident opinion is comprised of resident perspectives gathered in surveys from over 600 communities whose residents evaluated the same kinds of topics on The National Community Survey. The comparison evaluations are from the most recent survey completed in each community; most communities conduct surveys every year or in alternating years. NRC adds the latest results quickly upon survey completion, keeping the benchmark data fresh and relevant. The communities in the database represent a wide geographic and population range. Gunnison County chose to have comparisons made to the entire database and a subset of similar jurisdictions from the database: Western states (AZ, CO, ID, MT, NM, UT, WY, AK, CA, OR, WA) with populations up to 40,000 residents.

Interpreting the Results

Ratings are compared when there are at least five communities in which a similar question was asked. Where comparisons are available, four columns are provided in the table. The first column is Gunnison County’s “percent positive.” The percent positive is the combination of the top two most positive response options (i.e., “excellent” and “good,” “very safe” and “somewhat safe,” etc.), or, in the case of resident behaviors/participation, the percent positive represents the proportion of respondents indicating “yes” or participating in an activity at least once a month. The second column is the rank assigned to Gunnison County’s rating among communities where a similar question was asked. The third column is the number of communities that asked a similar question. The final column shows the comparison of Gunnison County’s rating to the benchmark.

In that final column, Gunnison County’s results are noted as being “higher” than the benchmark, “lower” than the benchmark or “similar” to the benchmark, meaning that the average rating given by Gunnison County residents is statistically similar to or different (greater or lesser) than the benchmark. Being rated as “higher” or “lower” than the benchmark means that Gunnison County’s average rating for a particular item was more than 10 points different than the benchmark. If a rating was “much higher” or “much lower,” then Gunnison County’s average rating was more than 20 points different when compared to the benchmark.

Appendix C: Detailed Survey Methods

The National Community Survey™ (The NCS™), conducted by National Research Center, Inc., was developed to provide communities an accurate, affordable and easy way to assess and interpret resident opinion about important local topics. Standardization of common questions and survey methods provide the rigor to assure valid results, and each community has enough flexibility to construct a customized version of The NCS.

Results offer insight into residents' perspectives about the community as a whole, including local amenities, services, public trust, resident participation and other aspects of the community in order to support budgeting, land use and strategic planning and communication with residents. Resident demographic characteristics permit comparison to the Census as well as comparison of results for different subgroups of residents. The government of Gunnison County funded this research. Survey Validity

The question of survey validity has two parts: 1) how can a community be confident that the results from those who completed the questionnaire are representative of the results that would have been obtained had the survey been administered to the entire population? and 2) how closely do the perspectives recorded on the survey reflect what residents really believe or do?

To answer the first question, the best survey research practices were used for the resources spent to ensure that the results from the survey respondents reflect the opinions of residents in the entire community. These practices include:

- Using a mail-out/mail-back methodology, which typically gets a higher response rate than phone for the same dollars spent. A higher response rate lessens the worry that those who did not respond are different than those who did respond.
- Selecting households at random within the community to receive the survey to ensure that the households selected to receive the survey are representative of the larger community.
- Over-sampling multi-family housing units to improve response from hard-to-reach, lower income or younger apartment dwellers.
- Selecting the respondent within the household using an unbiased sampling procedure; in this case, the "birthday method." The cover letter included an instruction requesting that the respondent in the household be the adult (18 years old or older) who most recently had a birthday, irrespective of year of birth.
- Contacting potential respondents three times to encourage response from people who may have different opinions or habits than those who would respond with only a single prompt.
- Inviting response in a compelling manner (using appropriate letterhead/logos and a signature of a visible leader) to appeal to recipients' sense of civic responsibility.
- Providing a pre-addressed, postage-paid return envelope.
- Offering the survey in Spanish or other language when requested by a given community.
- Weighting the results to reflect the demographics of the population.

The answer to the second question about how closely the perspectives recorded on the survey reflect what residents really believe or do is more complex. Resident responses to surveys are influenced by a variety of factors. For questions about service quality, residents' expectations for service quality play a role as well as the "objective" quality of the service provided, the way the resident perceives the entire community (that is, the context in which the service is provided), the scale on which the resident is asked to record his or her opinion and, of course, the opinion, itself, that a resident holds about the service. Similarly a resident's report of certain behaviors is colored by what he or she believes is the socially desirable response (e.g., reporting tolerant behaviors toward "oppressed groups," likelihood of voting for a tax increase for services to poor people, use of alternative modes of travel to work besides the single occupancy vehicle), his or her memory of the actual behavior (if it is not a question speculating about future actions, like a vote), his or her confidence that he or she can be honest without suffering any negative consequences (thus the need for anonymity) as well as the actual behavior itself.

How closely survey results come to recording the way a person really feels or behaves often is measured by the coincidence of reported behavior with observed current behavior (e.g., driving habits), reported intentions to behave with observed future behavior (e.g., voting choices) or reported opinions about current community quality

with objective characteristics of the community (e.g., feelings of safety correlated with rates of crime). There is a body of scientific literature that has investigated the relationship between reported behaviors and actual behaviors. Well-conducted surveys, by and large, do capture true respondent behaviors or intentions to act with great accuracy. Predictions of voting outcomes tend to be quite accurate using survey research, as do reported behaviors that are not about highly sensitive issues (e.g., family abuse or other illegal or morally sanctioned activities). For self-reports about highly sensitive issues, statistical adjustments can be made to correct for the respondents' tendency to report what they think the "correct" response should be.

Research on the correlation of resident opinion about service quality and "objective" ratings of service quality vary, with some showing stronger relationships than others. NRC's own research has demonstrated that residents who report the lowest ratings of street repair live in communities with objectively worse street conditions than those who report high ratings of street repair (based on road quality, delay in street repair, number of road repair employees). Similarly, the lowest rated fire services appear to be "objectively" worse than the highest rated fire services (expenditures per capita, response time, "professional" status of firefighters, breadth of services and training provided). Resident opinion commonly reflects objective performance data but is an important measure on its own. NRC principals have written, "If you collect trash three times a day but residents think that your trash haul is lousy, you still have a problem."


Selecting Survey Recipients

"Sampling" refers to the method by which households were chosen to receive the survey. All households within the Gunnison County were eligible to participate in the survey. A list of all households within the zip codes serving Gunnison County was purchased from Go-Dog Direct based on updated listings from the United States Postal Service. Since some of the zip codes that serve Gunnison County households may also serve addresses that lie outside of the community, the exact geographic location of each housing unit was compared to community boundaries using the most current municipal boundary file (updated on a quarterly basis) and addresses located outside of Gunnison County boundaries were removed from consideration

To choose the 1,700 survey recipients, a systematic sampling method was applied to the list of households previously screened for geographic location. Systematic sampling is a procedure whereby a complete list of all possible households is culled, selecting every *N*th one, giving each eligible household a known probability of selection, until the appropriate number of households is selected. Multi-family housing units were selected at a higher rate as residents of this type of housing typically respond at lower rates to surveys than do those in single-family housing units. Figure 1 displays a map of the households selected to receive the survey. In general, because of the random sampling techniques used, the displayed sampling density will closely mirror the overall housing unit density (which may be different from the population density). While the theory of probability assumes no bias in selection, there may be some minor variations in practice (meaning, an area with only 15% of the housing units might be selected at an actual rate that is slightly above or below that).

An individual within each household was selected using the birthday method. The birthday method selects a person within the household by asking the "person whose birthday has most recently passed" to complete the questionnaire. The underlying assumption in this method is that day of birth has no relationship to the way people respond to surveys. This instruction was contained in the cover letter accompanying the questionnaire.

Survey Administration and Response

Selected households received three mailings, one week apart, beginning on July 19, 2019. The first mailing was a prenotification postcard announcing the upcoming survey. The next mailing contained a letter from the Chairperson of the Board of County Commissioners inviting the household to participate, a questionnaire and a postage-paid return envelope. The final mailing contained a reminder letter, another survey and a postage-paid return envelope. The second cover letter asked those who had not completed the survey to do so and those who had already done so to refrain from turning in another survey. The survey was available in English. Both cover letters included a URL through which the residents selected for the mail survey could choose respond online rather than by mail. Gunnison County chose to augment their administration of The NCS with one additional service: custom benchmark comparisons. Completed surveys were collected over the following seven weeks.

About 7% of the 1,700 surveys mailed were returned because the housing unit was vacant or the postal service was unable to deliver the survey as addressed. Of the remaining 1,573 households that received the survey, 429 completed the survey, providing an overall response rate of 27%. Of the 429 completed surveys, 61 were completed online. The response rate was calculated using AAPOR’s response rate #2¹ for mailed surveys of unnamed persons.

Confidence Intervals

It is customary to describe the precision of estimates made from surveys by a “level of confidence” and accompanying “confidence interval” (or margin of error). A traditional level of confidence, and the one used here, is 95%. The 95% confidence interval can be any size and quantifies the sampling error or imprecision of the survey results because some residents’ opinions are relied on to estimate all residents’ opinions.²

The margin of error for Gunnison County survey is no greater than plus or minus five percentage points around any given percent reported for all respondents (429 completed surveys).

For subgroups of responses, the margin of error increases because the number of respondents for the subgroup is smaller.

Survey Processing (Data Entry)

Upon receipt, completed surveys were assigned a unique identification number. Additionally, each survey was reviewed and “cleaned” as necessary. For example, a question may have asked a respondent to pick two items out of a list of five, but the respondent checked three; in this case, NRC would use protocols to randomly choose two of the three selected items for inclusion in the dataset.

All surveys then were entered twice into an electronic dataset; any discrepancies were resolved in comparison to the original survey form. Range checks as well as other forms of quality control were also performed.

NRC used SurveyGizmo, a web-based survey and analytics platform, to collect the online survey data. Use of an online system means all collected data are entered into the dataset when the respondents submit the surveys. Skip patterns are programmed into system so respondents are automatically “skipped” to the appropriate question based on the individual responses being given. Online programming also allows for more rigid control of the data format, making extensive data cleaning unnecessary.

A series of quality control checks were also performed in order to ensure the integrity of the web data. Steps may include and not be limited to reviewing the data for clusters of repeat IP addresses and time stamps (indicating duplicate responses) and removing empty submissions (questionnaires submitted with no questions answered).

Survey Data Weighting

The demographic characteristics of the survey respondents were compared to those found in the 2010 Census and American Community Survey estimates for adults in Gunnison County. The primary objective of weighting survey data is to make the survey respondents reflective of the larger population of the community. The characteristics used for weighting were housing tenure (rent or own), housing unit type (attached or detached), race, ethnicity,

² A 95% confidence interval indicates that for every 100 random samples of this many residents, 95 of the confidence intervals created will include the “true” population response. This theory is applied in practice to mean that the “true” perspective of the target population lies within the confidence interval created for a single survey. For example, if 75% of residents rate a service as “excellent” or “good,” then the 4% margin of error (for the 95% confidence interval) indicates that the range of likely responses for the entire community is between 71% and 79%. This source of uncertainty is called sampling error. In addition to sampling error, other sources of error may affect any survey, including the non-response of residents with opinions different from survey responders. Though standardized on The NCS, on other surveys, differences in question wording, order, translation and data entry, as examples, can lead to somewhat varying results.

Survey Data Analysis and Reporting

The survey dataset was analyzed using the Statistical Package for the Social Sciences (SPSS). For the most part, the percentages presented in the reports represent the “percent positive.” The percent positive is the combination of the top two most positive response options (i.e., “excellent” and “good,” “very safe” and “somewhat safe,” “essential” and “very important,” etc.), or, in the case of resident behaviors/participation, the percent positive represents the proportion of respondents indicating “yes” or participating in an activity at least once a month.

On many of the questions in the survey respondents may answer “don’t know.” The proportion of respondents giving this reply is shown in the full set of responses included in Appendix A. However, these responses have been removed from the analyses presented in the reports. In other words, the tables and graphs display the responses from respondents who had an opinion about a specific item. When a table for a question that only permitted a single response does not total to exactly 100%, it is due to the common practice of percentages being rounded to the nearest whole number.


